It is important to note that, even if you aren't buying photos, every student needs to bring their envelope on the day because it has their unique details on it.

As the weather is warming up, we are seeing increases in students with head lice. Check your child's hair regularly to avoid infestation. A good habit for your child to get into is the put some cheap conditioner and use a nit comb to comb through their hair each night when they have a bath or shower. This means you will get the lice out before they have a chance to lay any eggs. If your child has live lice and nits, they have a 9 day life cycle. Comb the lice out every day for 2 weeks and you will get on top of it. Please do not send your child to school if they have live lice in their hair. Thank you for your ongoing support with this.

Next term, booklists will be sent home. We negotiate the very lowest price we can for the items and review them vigorously to keep the cost at the lowest it can be. If it is on the booklist, we have deemed in absolutely necessary for your child to participate fully in their learning opportunities at school. Please purchase the booklist if possible.




